



UTAR Sungai Long Campus Staff Member Tested Positive for COVID-19 While Working From Home During the CMCO

UTAR confirms that one staff member from Sungai Long Campus was tested positive for COVID-19 on 31 October 2020 and is currently receiving medical attention at a government hospital. The last visit by the staff member to the campus was on 12 October 2020. Since then, and throughout the CMCO period, the staff member has been working from home, which is located outside Sungai Long. The staff member has not been to campus during the CMCO period and did not come into close contact with any staff or students. For safety and health reasons, sanitization was done on all related areas on campus.

Following the instructions of the Ministry of Higher Education, UTAR has implemented full online teaching and learning from home since 5 October 2020, and Sungai Long Campus staff have been working from home since the CMCO commenced from 14 October 2020 until now. The campus has been closed since the start of the CMCO.

UTAR has been sanitising the campus on a regular basis and has been following the standard operating procedures and the safety and health guidelines of the Ministry of Health. The health and well-being of our staff and students are our top priority and we will continue to follow the standard operating procedures and instructions from MOH and be vigilant in our efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
